

# **Missionary Health Care**

<u>Distinguished Service Award</u> – is a tribute to church people for their service to the church. This is a church given award. The cost is \$ 125.00 per award and ordering this online is the preferred way. The certificate fits in an 8"X12" frame. (Frames are not included.)

<u>Gifts from the Heart</u> – an offering to send for the fund to honor or memorialize someone. This amount is up to the person to give. There is a card to send to the person who was acknowledged. This is one other option.

# CRISIS CARE KITS/SCHOOL PAL PAKS

#### Crisis Care Kits Information

Gather the following <u>NEW</u> items in the quantities listed below. <u>DO NOT PUT EXTRA THINGS OR</u> <u>DIFFERENT SIZES IN. It has to be exactly like this</u> <u>list. No substitutes.</u>

Pack the items in a 2-gallon or 2.5-gallon Ziplock bag. (The recipients will use the bag to carry water once it is emptied, so please use new bags.)

- 1 medium size bottle of shampoo (12-18 oz.) and please tape the tops shut.
- 2 bars of soap (bath size, not travel)
- 1 medium toothpaste (4.0-6.4 oz.)
- 3 toothbrushes (in original packaging)
- 1 box of Band-Aids 30 or more
- 1 fingernail clipper (no toenail clippers)
- 1 sturdy hair comb
- 2 hand towels (no washcloths or dishcloths)
- 4 pocket size packages of tissue (facial tissue)
- 1 Beanie Baby size stuffed toy (not dirty)

Package the items in the gallon bags. Obtain a banana box from the grocery store. Fill each box with six (6) Crisis Care Kits. Do not send money or flyers in the boxes. Label the box with your church name on it.

Bring the box to convention with \$ 25.00 per box for transporting it. If you want to send it yourself, please follow the directions at: fawngrovecompassioncenter.org.

#### School Pal Paks Information

Gather the following <u>NEW</u> items in the quantities listed below. <u>DO NOT PUT EXTRA THINGS OR</u> <u>DIFFERENT SIZES IN. It has to be exactly like this</u> <u>list. No substitutes.</u>

Pack the items in a 1-gallon Ziplock bag. (The recipients will use the bags to carry their lunches or water once it is emptied, so please use new bags.)

- 2 Composition notebooks, no larger than 9 ¾ in X 7 ½ inch. **NO SPIRAL NOTEBOOKS.**
- 1 package of # 2 pencils (quantity of 10-20)
- 1 package of black pens (quantity of 10-20)
- 2 pink erasers, 2-3 inches long
- 2 rulers (6" or 12", with metric measurements)
- 1 package of colored pencils (quantity 12-15)
- 1 pair of blunt-nosed scissors
- 1 hand-held pencil sharpener

This School Pal Pak will be for 2 students to share.

Package the items in the gallon bags. Obtain a 12"X12"x12" box from an office supply store. Fill each box with 10 Pal Paks, no more or no less. Use strong tape to tape the box securely shut. Label the box with your church name on it.

Bring the box to convention with \$ 25.00 per box for transporting it. If you want to send it yourself, please follow the directions at: <u>fawngrovecompassioncenter.org.</u>

# CRISIS CARE KITS EXTENDED GUIDELINES

Gather NEW items in the quantities listed. Include ONLY those items listed. Do NOT add any items that are not listed. Crisis Care Kits are approved for both export from our country and import to other countries based on the specific list of items on the CCK instruction list. These approvals are made in advance of any shipment so that when they are inspected by the customs officials, they are easily cleared. If there are any deviations from the pre-approved customs list, it causes delay, potential additional costs in country, and possible refusal.

Helpful tips:

Shampoo – 12-18 oz bottle. **Tape** flip-tops closed to prevent any leaking during shipping and handling. Do NOT include any medicated shampoos. If it is a shampoo and conditioner in one, you can use it.

2 bars of soap - Bath size or larger in their own packaging. No hotel or travel size.

- 1 medium toothpaste 4.0 to 6.4 oz size. Check the expiration dates. They should be at least 18 months out from the date of packing. If it says Made in the USA, it is okay. Just NO flags on the boxes (AIM).
- 3 toothbrushes in original packaging This can be a 1, 2 or 3 pack. Do NOT cut open a package with more than 3 brushes because it breaks the seal.
- 1 box of Band-Aid type bandages, 30 or more (it can be 100) (any brand) These may be in their own box or may be packed individually in a zip-type bag (30 per bag) as long as the bandages are individually wrapped and sealed. Please use "regular" size bandages and not really small or tiny ones.
- 1 fingernail clipper Do NOT use toenail clippers or any clippers in a package with other items such as emory boards, etc. Clippers do not have to be in their own packaging.
- 1 sturdy hair comb Include a SINGLE comb and not a package of combs. Use a size comb that will be suitable for all ages of hair type. Do NOT use small pocket combs, narrow styling combs with points on them, or combs that are thin and easy to break. The comb can bend a little. If it will go through your hair, it is fine.
- 2 hand towels Do NOT use dish/kitchen towels. Do NOT use washcloths. In many other world areas, washcloths are not used. Towel size should be approximately 15 inches by 28 inches. They can be thin or thick weight.

4 pocket-size packages of facial tissue (Kleenex style) - Do NOT include packages of more than 4.

1 Beanie-baby size stuffed toy – It does NOT have to be a Beanie baby brand. Do NOT include any other type of small toy. Do NOT include a stuffed toy that is larger or smaller than the Beanie-baby size. Do NOT include items that have Christian symbols, American flags, USA or similar to it. These are not welcome in many other areas of the World. The preferred size is 6 – 8 inches tall. Do NOT send small McDonald Beanie toys.

Do NOT include any notes, cards or drawings. Do NOT include any money or currency. In many other world areas, these items are not welcome.






#### Ideas on how to promote World Week of Prayer in your church:

- 1. Have regular prayer requests posted in your church (bulletin boards, flyers, etc.) during the year.
- 2. The children can decorate bookmarks for the week and pass them out to the adults in the congregation.
- 3. Put together a bag of M&Ms or Skittles and label one color per day and have them eat the assigned color and pray for the region as they eat it. You will need to put a card with the baggies for explanations.
- 4. Assign each day of the week to a specific group of people in your church to pray.
  Example: Sunday Whole church, Monday Women, Tuesday Men, Wednesday Children, Thursday Teens, Friday Senior Adults and Saturday Whole church.
- 5. Subscribe to the NMI Central, an email which is sent every Wednesday from the Global NMI office for current praises and prayer requests.
- 6. Form a prayer network.
- 7. The children can make a paper chain with each request on a chain link and they take a link off each day and pray for the region each day. There would be 7 strips of paper. Make it fun.

- I will submit the year-end report on time.
- I will prepare for local NMI council meetings to include: reporting, vision-casting, teambuilding, planning and implementing the NMI goals.
- I will hold local NMI council members accountable for their roles.
- I will provide on-going training to local NMI council members, giving them written job descriptions, including examples of what has been successful and resource materials.
- I will emphasize the importance of Mission Priority One and urge my church to meet and exceed all goals.
- I will set goals for my Church to include children and youth in all NMI activities.

#### **2022 NAZARENE FUN FACTS**

- The Church of the Nazarene ministers in 164 world areas.
- In 2022, there were 489 missionaries originating from 63 world areas, serving 91 countries. Of these missionaries, 325 served as global deployed and 164 were sponsored deployed. Last year, there were 60 new missionary deployments. Within these missionary families, there are 306 missionary kids.
- The number of Nazarene churches grew to 30,518 churches with 2.65 million members, a decrease from last year.
- In 2022, there were 468 districts and 33 pioneer areas around the world, with 31,461 credentialed clergy.
- 50 educational institutions, including graduate seminaries/theological colleges, 12 liberal arts colleges/universities, 30 undergraduate seminaries/theological/Bible colleges, 2 nurses training colleges, 1 teacher training college and 1,032 education centers (extensions) had a 2022 combined enrollment of 45,124 students globally.
- Persons in need were treated at community-based clinics and health care centers all over the world with concentrated efforts in India, Papua New Guinea and Eswatini (formally known as Swaziland).
- 376 retired missionaries received benefits through the Global Missions Pension Plan for the 2021-2022 fiscal year.
- NMI membership for 2022 was 1,042,338, with 19,558 organized local NMIs.
- JESUS Film Harvest Partners (JFHP) raised \$4.3 million, reports that World Evangelism Fund (WEF) helped provide infrastructure for 960 JFHP teams to share God's love. In 2022, the teams reported 2 million evangelistic contacts. Of these contacts, 584,063 indicated decisions for Christ with 366,191 initial discipleship follow-ups. The teams started 10,771 preaching points in 2022.
- NMI and others partnered with local churches to help raise US \$ 38.6 million through the World Evangelism Fund during the 2021-2022 fiscal year.
- Churches globally gave US \$31.4 million for Approved Mission Specials.
- In 2022, 99 districts gave 5.5 percent of their income and beyond to the WEF (54 of which were from regions other than the US/Canada region). WEF giving beyond 5.5 percent helps open new work, sustain works opened in recent years and helps send new missionaries that God calls.
- Missionary Health Care provided US \$406,362 in medical assistance for Nazarene missionaries, through offerings, Memorial Roll gifts and Distinguished Service Award gifts.
- Nazarenes gave US \$256,610 to World Mission Broadcast (WMB) providing radio, television, and internet programs to share the gospel globally.
- Nazarenes gave US \$ 4.2 million in deputation offerings for missionaries.
- NMI has all 6 regions participating in LINKS, contributing \$129,203, and creating personalized connections between local churches, districts and missionaries around the world. Each connection is vital in continuing to share about the impact of missions.
- Nazarenes gave US \$2.9 million for Alabaster to fund construction projects in 2022. The offering is used in all 6 regions.
- NMI partnered with NCM to give more than US \$ 8.4 million for disaster response and compassion projects around the world and to support 11,126 children through Development Centers and Pastor's kids program.
- NMI assisted Work and Witness in raising approximately US \$999,576.

# Engaging Children and Youth

Provide opportunities for the children and youth to learn and experience mission and to respond to God's call.

Ideas on how to get them involved:

- Plan a service activity one a month or once a quarter. Remember that we have ministries on the district that need help Flint Eastside Mission, Little Lamb's Compassionate Ministry Center, small churches, Flint Forge, etc.
- Participate in youth mission trips or join with another church for a trip. You can do trips in the USA also Native American Christian Academy in Sun Valley, AZ, Cherokee Indian Reservation in North Carolina, Fawn Grove Compassion Center, etc.
- Participate in Crisis Care Kits and School Pal Paks collecting items and packing.
- Encourage children and youth to give financially to WEF, District Projects, Alabaster, etc.
- Explain the concept of compassion, missions, service and prayer with them.
- When having a missionary at your church, have the missionary talk to them at a separate time or have an event with them bowling, laser tag, etc.
- Volunteer in Community Service Centers, Day Centers and Mission Centers.
- Volunteer to help clean up senior citizens yards or pick up trash around playgrounds and school grounds.
- Youth do leaf raking, pick up sticks in the yards after winter, shrub trimming or window washing for the elderly.
- Go to a shopping center and take back shopping carts for the store and help the employees out.
